

Amy Rosenkrans, Ph.D.

Amy Rosenkrans is a lifelong resident of Havre de Grace. After graduating from Havre de Grace High School, she attended the College of Notre Dame of Maryland University and Goucher College. She received her PhD from Notre Dame of Maryland University where she wrote the dissertation *"The Good Work": Saint Frances Orphan Asylum and Saint Elizabeth Home, Two Baltimore Orphanages for African Americans*. In 2017, she was awarded the Joseph L. Arnold Prize for Outstanding Writing on Baltimore History by the Baltimore City Historical Society.

Dr. Rosenkrans is currently sharing her passion for history with middle school students in Baltimore City. She has previously served as the Executive Coordinator for Arts Integration in Prince George's County Public Schools, the Director of Humanities for Baltimore City Public Schools and Social Studies Teacher at Havre de Grace High School.

In her spare time, she is a volunteer researcher with the Maryland Women's Heritage Center where she is working to document the work of Maryland Suffragists. Her work is featured in Preservation Maryland's Ballot and Beyond Podcast Series. Additionally, Amy was successful in lobbying to get a historical marker in Havre de Grace commemorating the work of Harford County Suffragists.
